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Dear Parents and Carers.

Covid-19 Precautions Update

I wrote to you on Friday informing you that following the latest government advice, school will remain open for the foreseeable future. This advice remains in place. However, in order to slow the spread of the virus and protect the vulnerable and elderly in our communities revised guidance was issued by the government yesterday. The following new procedures will be in place with immediate effect:

- If anyone in your household has a temperature, new persistent cough, or any other symptoms listed on the government advice website, you must **self isolate for fourteen days**. This means that no one in your immediate household must attempt to enter the school grounds or premises, or any other public place, even if they appear well.
- If your child is currently off with a temperature, new persistent cough, or any other symptoms listed on the government advice website, your immediate household should follow government advice, which is currently to self isolate for fourteen days. Please do not send your ill child or their well siblings to school for fourteen days.

We appreciate that these new measures may cause some inconvenience to families, but we have no alternative other than to follow government advice and take every precaution to safeguard our children, staff and greater school community.

If your child has other symptoms please contact your GP for advice or ring NHS 111.

To help prevent the spread of infection the government recommends:

- Regularly wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, or use an alcohol based sanitiser if soap and
 water aren't available. It is particularly important to wash your hands after being outside, being in public areas handling
 money/payment card machines, before touching your face, after coughing/sneezing/blowing your nose and before eating
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue (or into the fold of your arm if you do not have a tissue) then throw the tissue in a bin and wash or sanitise your hands
- Regularly clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces in the home
- If you're worried about your symptoms, please call NHS 111 don't go directly to your GP or other healthcare
 environment
